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In regards to maths we would now be continuing to secure our knowledge of numbers to 5, then 10. This includes:


- Rote counting to 10, then 20.
- Touch counting up to 5, then 10 objects with good 1:1 correspondence.
- Counting out up to 5, then 10 objects from a larger set.
- Recognising numbers to 5, then 10.
- Counting two sets and finding the total (to 10) e.g. 4 cars and 3 trains make 7 altogether.
- Ordering numbers to 5, then 10.
- Number formation.
- Finding different ways to make numbers. The children were really enjoying using the numicon to help them do this, but you can use objects you have at home e.g. making 5: 4 and 1 makes 5; 3 and 2 makes 5; 2 and 3 makes 5, 3 and 1 and 1 makes 5 etc. Children may start recording these as addition sums.
- Writing practical addition sums (to 10) for children to work out using their toys.
- Using a dice for children to roll two numbers, write the addition sum and work out the answer.

In phonics this week we would have been learning about the letter 'c'. We would have learnt the letter name and the sound. Remember to use the pure sound:

In regards to the jolly phonics song, please only teach the first half of the song about castanets. The second half about kites will be used for next weeks phonics:

Within phonics we would be finding objects that start with a 'c' sound. We would also be practicing our oral blending e.g. teacher says c-a-t; children hear that the word is 'cat'. Some children may also be able to use their robot arms to chop up the words e.g. teacher says 'cat'; children use robot arms and say 'c-a-t'. Some children may be ready to read CVC words and match them to pictures. Some words you could use are: cat; can; tap; pin; pat; mat; sit; nap; pan; dog etc.
