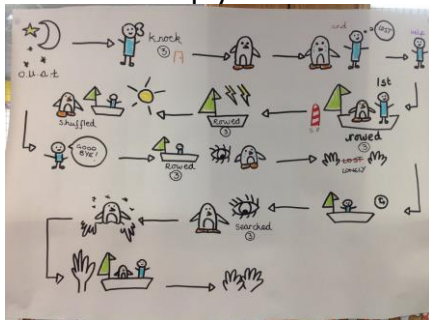
Story telling.
