Enforced School Closure Home Learning Project Ideas Year 3 Summer topic – Europe!

Research a European city and make a spider diagram of the facts you find.	Write/type a fact file using subheadings about a European city of your choice.
Make a poster to compare Wolverhampton to a European city. Think about houses, roads, cars, food, fashion/what they wear, schooling.	Learn to make a European themed meal/dish with a grown up.
Design a brightly coloured menu that has a starter, main course and dessert with a European theme (it could be from one European country or lots of different ones).	Write out a recipe for a traditional European meal.
Paint/collage/colour flags from different European countries.	Research the mountain ranges in Europe.
Design and make your own board game with a Europe theme. Don't forget to play your board game too! ©	See how long you can make a paper chain in 2 minutes. Measure it and then challenge someone else to see if they can make it longer than yours.
Go on a walk and count the rainbows you see in people's windows. Why not use a tally to help you count them?	Read a book and write down 5 questions for someone else to answer. Can you use these question words? Why, who, what, when.
Write a daily weather report for one week. Make sure to include lots of descriptive language. You could even record yourself reading out the weather just like they do on the TV.	Complete a spelling scribble every day for a week from the Year 3 and 4 common exception words in your pack. Choose 5 words to focus on each day.
