





Enforced School Closure Home Learning Project Ideas Year 4

This story is call a parable. Parables have hidden meaning in them, Jesus used them to teach his followers a lesson. Can you work out the hidden message in this story?</p> <p>Create your own modern day story with the same hidden message.</p>
<p>Maths – Graphing puddles</p> <p>This activity is best done after rain but you can make your own puddles outside.</p> <p>Choose a puddle and measure it every ½ hour. Record your information in a line graph. Write some questions to go with your graph.</p> <p>Extension – record and graph the measurements of two puddles, one in the sunshine and one in the shade. Compare your results. The Good Samaritan Luke 10:25-37

²⁵ One day an expert in religious law stood up to test Jesus by asking him this question: "Teacher, what should I do to inherit eternal life?"
